WORDS:

Salutations!:	Greetings!
Apologies:	I'm sorry.
Gratitude:	Thank you.
Glorious!	Great!
Exultation!	Rejoice!
Favor:	Like (ex: the gods favor you.).
Coin:	Money.
Besting:	Beating (ex: He is besting me at chess.).
Bested:	Won against. (ex: Titus bested Visuvius in the match.)
Embrace:	Accept.
Ignites:	Excites (ex: His battle ignites the crowd!).
Procure:	Obtain.

PHRASES:

Blessed by the gods:	Having good luck or fortune.
Gods favor you:	You have had good luck.
Untwist your tongue:	Speak freely.
Fall from your chair:	Move.
Remove the thought:	Forget about it.
Seize heart from chest:	Kill him.
Eclipse them all:	Stand above the others.
Press with accusation:	Accuse.
Rise above your station:	(1) Act as if you are better than you are. (2) Advance your social status or standing.
Heed medicus warning:	Listen to your doctor.
No cause for disappointment:	Don't be let down.
Cause imposition:	Bother you. (ex: Apologies to cause imposition with the matter of...)
Require favor:	Need approval.
Round with belly:	Pregnant.

ROMAN PEOPLE AND PLACES:

Arena:	The ring where gladiators fought. Named for the sand which soaked up the blood.
Gladiator:	One who fought in the arena. Often slaves, fighting for money or freedom, but sometimes freedmen fighting for fame.
Medicus:	Doctor.
Ludus:	Gladiator training center.
Lanista:	One who owns gladiators.
Doctores:	One who trains gladiators.
Editor:	The person who made the final decisions about the fates of the gladiators in the arena.
