The Game - It's the life and blood of every true player. It's not just about playing; it's about surviving and thriving in this high-stakes lifestyle.

Use these phrases wisely, keep your swagger on lock, and remember: at the Player's Ball, it's all about respect, style, and smooth operations. Stay fly, and keep your game tight!

Other terms and lingo you should know:

Bottom bitch or Bottom ho: Refers to the most trusted and dependable woman in a pimp's stable, often responsible for managing the others and setting an example.

Catch and release: A strategy where a pimp briefly takes control of a prostitute only to release her shortly after, often used to avoid legal troubles.

Catching a case: When a prostitute gets arrested by law enforcement.

Chili pimp: A term for a pimp who lacks control over their stable and fails to make significant money.

Choose up: When a prostitute decides to leave her current pimp for another.

Choosey Susie: A prostitute who goes from one pimp to another easily.

Dowry: A sum of money that a pimp might have to pay to another pimp for acquiring a prostitute from their stable. This money is meant to help recoup the lost money the former pimp will incur from losing a worker.

Exit Fee: A sum of money that a prostitute may be required to pay to a pimp in order to leave their stable. This fee is often imposed as a way for the pimp to recoup their investment in the prostitute's training, clothing, maintenance, and other expenses.

Gigolo: A man who is paid for his companionship or sexual services by women. A male prostitute

Green: Someone new to the pimping game or inexperienced.

Ho or Hoe: A term for a female prostitute.

Hustle: The act of working or making money, often through prostitution or other illicit activities.

Iceberg Slim: A reference to the famous pimp-turned-author who wrote about the pimping lifestyle in his books. The term is sometimes used to denote someone who is cold and calculating.

In the cut: A phrase meaning in a hidden or discreet location, often used in reference to where business is conducted.

John: A slang term for a client of a prostitute. The term is often used to refer to men who pay for sexual services.

Knocking: When a pimp successfully persuades a prostitute to leave her current pimp for him.

Mack or Macking: The act of seducing or persuading someone, often used in the context of recruiting women or conducting business.

Mack Daddy: A term used to refer to a highly successful and respected pimp, who is considered to have exceptional skills in manipulation and control over their prostitutes.

Out of pocket: Refers to a situation where a prostitute is not following the rules or is acting independently of the pimp's control.

Paper: Money, often earned through prostitution.

Peeling: The act of a pimp taking a portion of a prostitute's earnings.

Prostitute: A person who provides sexual services to clients. In the pimping world, they are often under the management of a pimp.

Renegade: A prostitute who works without a pimp.

Rolling: When a prostitute is actively working and making money.

Stable: The group of women and/or men managed by a pimp.

Splittin' a track: When two prostitutes work the same area or street, often under the direction of the same pimp, to maximize earnings and visibility to potential clients.

Square: Someone who is not involved in the pimping lifestyle, often used derogatorily.

The blade: Another term for the area where prostitutes work, derived from the blade of the street.

The game: Refers to the lifestyle and business of pimping and prostitution.

The Life: Another term for the lifestyle and business of pimping and prostitution.

The stroll: A term used to describe the area or street where prostitutes walk to find clients. It is similar to the track but often implies a more specific or localized area.

Track: The area where prostitutes work, often a specific street or neighborhood.

Trick: A client of a prostitute.
