- **Baggy** Refers to oversized clothing, particularly jeans, that was fashionable in the 90s.
- **Baller** A lavishly successful person. It can also describe someone or something as "excellent," especially in some spectacular way.
- **Bangin'** Describes something as extremely good or impressive, often used for music or food.
- **Beeotch** A playful or more emphasized way of saying "b*tch" that originates from the cult-classic, Clueless.

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- **Big Whoop** Yet another phrase that stems from the classic film, Clueless, "big whoop" is used to indicate that something is not important or impressive.
- **Bite Me** Used to express defiance or tell someone to leave you alone.
- **Bling** Flashy jewelry or accessories, especially those made of gold or diamonds.

Blow Up - To become very successful or popular quickly.

Bodacious - Used to describe something as remarkable or impressive.

Booyah - An exclamation used to express excitement or triumph.

- **Clutch** The "clutch" slang word originated in the '80s and '90s, describing something that happens exactly when it's needed. The meaning eventually lead to its broader use to describe anything "excellent" or "highly effective."
- **Cowabunga** This term was popularized by the television show, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles and was used as an exclamation of excitement or approval.
- **Cool Beans** Used to express approval or agreement.
- **Crib** Slang for someone's home or living space.
- **Crunk** State of high energy and excitement, often associated with partying and having a wild time.
- **Crusty** Particular group of people who dressed and behaved in a certain way.

D

- **Da Bomb** Something that is considered excellent or the best.
- **Dibs** If you want to claim something is yours, the fastest way to do it would be just saying "dibs!"


Dip (Let's Dip) - Another term for leaving or exiting, similar to "bounce."

Gig -	Refers to a job, especially one in entertainment or music.
Gnarly -	Used to describe something extreme, whether good or bad.
Grunge –	A style or genre of music and fashion that was popular in the early '90s.
Gucci –	this slang word refers to the Italian luxury brand Gucci. It also was used in place of say- ing "good."

H

Hasta La Vista, Baby - A catchphrase meaning "goodbye" or "see you later"

Hella - An intensifier meaning "very" or "a lot."

Homeboy/Homegirl/Homie - Refers to a close friend, typically someone from the same neighborhood.

Home Skillet - A term of endearment for a friend, similar to "homey" or "buddy."

Hoochie Mama – A derogatory term used to describe a woman who dresses provocatively. E

I Know You Are But What Am I? - One of the ultimate '90s insults. This phrase used to deflect an insult or criticism by turning it back on the speaker, often used humorously or child-ishly.

I'm Outtie - I'm leaving or going.

I Pity the Fool - A catchphrase used to express disdain or lack of sympathy

It's All Good - A phrase used to reassure someone that everything is fine

Jiggy - Means getting into the groove or having fun, popularized by Will Smith's song *Gettin' Jiggy Wit It*.

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Jinkies - An exclamation of surprise or discovery

Keepin' It Real - A phrase meaning to stay true to oneself or one's roots. **Kickin' It** - Hanging out or relaxing with friends.

L

Lame - Something or someone as boring, uncool, or inadequate.
Let's Bounce - A phrase meaning "let's leave" or "let's get out of here."
L8r - Later (a text message abbreviation).

M

Mad -	Used to emphasize something, as in "mad cool" or "mad skills."
Major -	Used to emphasise something, often combined with an adjective.
Mint –	Describes something in excellent condition, like new.

Mondo - Something huge or extreme.

N

- **No Diggity** An expression of agreement or approval, made popular by the Blackstreet song "No Diggity."
- **No Soup for You!** A '90s catchphrase that picked up popularity as a way to deny someone something they want. It originates from the popular "Soup Nazi" episode of the hit sitcom show, Seinfeld.
- **Not!** A sarcastic way to negate something that was just said, popularized by *Wayne's World*.

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DMG -	Oh my God (an expression of surprise or excitement).
Dff the Hook - Describes something as extremely good, exciting, or impressive.	

P

Phat -	Slang for something excellent, cool, or hot. It stands for "Pretty Hot And Tempting."
Props -	Short for "proper respects," used to give recognition or credit.
Puh-lease -	A dramatic, dismissive, or sarcastic way of saying "please," often used to express disbelief.

R

Rad -	Short for "radical." This word is 90s slang for cool or excellent.
Righteous -	Describes something as extremely good or excellent.
Rock On -	An expression of support or encouragement, often used in the context of music or achiev- ing something cool.

- **Say What?** This '90s term used to express surprise or ask for clarification was a popular catchphrase from the show Kenan & Kel.
- **Scrub** A derogatory term for someone who is perceived as lazy or unsuccessful, popularized by TLC's song *No Scrubs*.

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Schwing - Slang for excitement, first coined by Mike Myers in his "Wayne's World" Saturday Night Live sketch and movie spin-offs.

Scrilla - Slang for money or cash.

- **Shady** Describes someone who is suspicious, untrustworthy, or sneaky.
- **Shut Up** Contrary to its literal meaning of "stop talking," which is what Julie Andrews' character mistakenly interprets it for in the film, The Princess Diaries, this phrase is actually used to express surprise or disbelief.


Sick - Cool, great, or awesome.

- **Smokin'** A phrase used to describe someone or something as extremely attractive or impressive, popularised by the movie The Mask.

So Not Cool - Used to describe something that is unpleasant or undesirable.

Spiffy - Used to describe something that is stylish or neat.
